All families are invited to our Term 3 School/Parish mass this Sunday, 1st September at 8.30am in the




church. This is a great opportunity for our school families to get together with our parishioners and celebrate Mass and enjoy a cuppa, and a chat afterwards.



MEASELS OUTBREAK

We have been notified by Waikato Public Health regarding the large number of measles cases, particularly in South Auckland.

Our school has been asked to inform our school community that those not known to be immune from measles may be excluded SHOULD measles occur in our school.

What will happen if we have measle(s) cases: If Waikato Public Health contacts us we are required to take appropriate action:

- ensure exclusion of the case while infectious we will be advised by Waikato Public Health on a safe return date.
- exclude the susceptible contacts we will be advised by Waikato Public Health on exclusion period.

We Recommend That You:

- Check that you and your family's immunisations are up to date and if you have not already done so please provide the appropriate immunisation documents to the school office (families have been contacted if we do not have up to date or partially completed immunisation certificates). If we do not hold an immunisation record for your child, your child will be listed as not immunised.



Jesus tells about people who will be knocking at the door, but it will be too late. Everyone wants to get into heaven, but there is only one door and Jesus says the door is very narrow. SISTER'S OF THE MISSION SCHOLARSHIP



In 1904 the Sisters of the Mission opened St Peter's Catholic School in Cambridge. The Sisters taught in the school from 1904 until 1993. Since then the school has continued to have strong links with the Mission Sister's Charism. Euphrasie Barbier had a particular passion for Catholic education for young people. She had a desire to make God known and loved in all parts of the world through Catholic education. The Sisters still have a presence in Cambridge; in fact, the Sisters' Convent on the corner of the school site is where they still live today.

The Sister's of the Mission Scholarship will be awarded for the first time at the End of Year Prize giving. The Scholarship is open to all Year 6 students who will be Year 7 students at our school in 2020. There are two scholarships for \$250. The Applicants are to write a reflective piece based on a criteria. The reflective piece will be written as part of the RE programme in class.
