Nothing can be achieved without a plan, workforce and way of doing things.

This whakatauki is paticularly significant as we are in a position to share our Outdoor Learning Environment project designs. These designs have been developed over the past year with input from students, staff, parents and our architects.

Principal's Reflection

We have completed the design phase and are now seeking feedback from our parent community. I have included the 3D images in this newsletter for your perusal. We are planning to approach the project in three stages.

Stage One: (approx. \$160,000)

Demolish the existing swimming pool changing rooms and PE shed. Build new building which contains the changing rooms, pump room and PE shed.

Stage Two: (approx. \$80,000)

Install the new astroturf area. This will be an all weather surface for netball, basketball, hockey and soccer.

Stage Three: (approx. \$80,000)

Connection between changing rooms, astroturf and hall with a large deck and verandah cover.

Fundraising

The PTFA have been raising funds for our Outdoor Learning Environment for the past two years. They have raised approx \$40,000. As a Catholic School we are able to apply to the Financial Assistance Scheme at a rate of \$2 for every \$1 fundraised. The PTFA have two fundraisers planned for this year. Our goal is to begin Stage One this year.



We will be signing the designs off at our next BOT meeting on 22nd June 2016. I encourage any feedback on our plans to be emailed to me by next Tuesday 22/06/16.
