Nice to catch up with you all! I have a lot to tell you so I hope you have relaxed with a cool drink Stranger (or maybe a hot one, you can't tell with this crazy weather) after a long working day - ready for a read.

NEIGHBOURHOOD SUPPORT Cambridge, is on the move.

- Firstly you will have a new Safety Officer joining our ranks as I have, after nearly 5 years, tendered my resignation. The new Safety Officer will start February 2017! My thanks to you all for embracing NEIGHBOURHOOD SUPPORT and special thanks to all our group leaders. Hopefully we are NOW all familiar with our CRIME mantra "MAKE IT HARD" and our natural or man-made DISASTER mantra "STAY AT HOME"!
- NS Cambridge will continue to be here for us all, in fact we are growing FAST and in need of a new premises and a new computer system. We have out grown both. For instance this bulk email will take me 3-4 days to get out to you, hence the reason I haven't been in touch as much as I would have liked to. GetsReady is a programme that eventuated after the last Christchurch earthquake, so it is a possibility for our new and efficient direction.
- CCTV and Cambridge Safer Communities Charitable Trust. CCTV is a safety measure which has been approved by the authorities and is now at the stage of finding funding. Cameras will be situated at entrances to the town, in the CBD and in other areas that the police may find relevant. If you wish to donate one of these cameras we would love to hear from you. Also, if you are a business in town and wish to have a camera in your particular area, then please make your interest known and we will forward it onto the committee involved.
- COMMUNITY PATROL Cambridge Safer Communities Charitable Trust is also involved in the establishment of Community Patrol with volunteer drivers patrolling our town and district. There is a lot involved along with some serious training; however we are working towards making it happen. We will be calling for volunteers early in the New Year.
- CHRISTMAS is almost upon us so remember when shopping, put gifts in the boot plus don't have your tree and presents visible to the road.

And the SUMMER HOLIDAYS are just around the corner!

- Be prepared! If you are going away, make sure your neighbours either side and across the road, are aware. Ask them to ring you if anything appears to be different.
- Some tips cancel mail and papers but arrange for junk mail to be bought in, have curtains opened and closed (or at least leave curtains, blinds open), have a lamp on a timer, turn the telephone ring down, ask a neighbour to use the drive occasionally and even your clothesline. Leave a spare key with a neighbour ("not" hidden), ensure as you leave that your home, garage and sheds are securely locked, including windows.
- Don't leave tools, toys or ladders out on the yard lock everything away!
- ENSURE LAWNS ARE MOWED REGULARLY.
- Doors clear no NOTES...

FINALLY - have all vehicles thoroughly checked - car, boat, caravan - before your trip.
