STRANGER DANGER ALERT

There have recently been several incidences reported in Cambridge where children



have been approached by a man who has attempted to lure them into his car while they were walking home from school. This morning a man approached a Cambridge East student on their way to school, so we are asking that our students are extra vigilant walking to school. The car is described as a small silver car. Police

are providing extra patrols in the school area.

Police Advice

- It is timely to talk to your children about how to get to and from school safely and other places they go - whether they walk, bike or go by bus.
- Make clear rules about getting home.
- Go to school with your child so that you can show them the safest route.
- Teach children to walk home together in pairs or small groups, not alone.
- Anyone who has immediate concern for their safety should not hesitate to call 111.
- Police actively encourage students to report anything that makes them feel unsafe or uncomfortable.
