
UNIFORM SALES

For non-accredited kids - Monday 5-6pm (Junior Accreditation Session)

Level 1 (On the track schedule as Junior Learn to Race (Level 1) - for newly accredited kids or still within their first 3 months after being accredited/not very experienced/not raced Friday nights yet or have but in Grade 5 - Tuesday 4-5pm

Level 2 (On the schedule as Junior Development (Level 2) - for kids who can comfortably race Fridays but probably still in Grade 3 or 4/reasonably fit ie can ride 8-10 laps at a reasonable pace/comfortable riding in a bunch - Tuesday 5-6pm

Level 3 (On the track schedule as Junior Advanced) - for kids who are competent and have been racing on Fridays for some time, usually in Grades 1 or 2/would be able to race at National level events/could ride the stayers line for 8-10 laps comfortably - Tuesdays 6-7pm

There will be more sessions available as the year progresses including Junior Coached sessions and Junior Fitness sessions.

You will also have the option of moving groups as you become fitter/more competent

When that happens, where can we


