Ngā mihi o te Aranga Easter greetings to you

On Holy Thursday the school gathered for our Easter Liturgy. This year the students took us through a moving liturgy focusing on the Stations of the Cross. The prayers helped us to focus on Jesus and see how we need to treat others in our lives. The students read these prayers beautifully. Thank you to Mrs McCreery and Mrs Gordon for all the hard work putting our school liturgy together and working with the teachers and students.

From Easter Sunday and during the liturgical season of Easter, a special candle is lit called the 'Paschal Candle'. It reminds us that Jesus has destroyed death and is alive. The Paschal candle is a symbol of new life and that Jesus is the 'Light of the World'.



Easter eggs are also a symbol of new life. Just like the chick has to break free from the shell to begin a new life, Jesus had to break free from death in the tomb. He invites us to share in the new life which God has promised to us all.
